CHAPLAIN'S CORNER



"Praise the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and the God of all comfort. He comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any kind of affliction, through the comfort we ourselves receive from God." – 2 Corinthians 1:3-4

Over the last few months, the number of patients hospitalized due to COVID-19 remains stable, even as the numbers of those infected in our province continue to decrease. There have also been several hospitalized due to persistent respiratory infections such as coughs, flus, and pneumonia. This may help to explain why the number of Lutheran patients in hospital remains quite substantial. The comfort of Christ, which LuMinHoS brings to hospital bedsides, continues to be welcomed (and needed) by patients, accompanying them on their hospital journey.

Paul's second letter to the Corinthians was written to commend the church in Corinth for re-

ceiving his first letter. First Corinthians admonished those who were spreading rumours about Paul, saying he was a wayward apostle not properly following (or teaching) the faith. His letter helped most in the church to understand their informants were wrong. And now, in another very Christ-centered letter, Paul asks the church to forgive those dissenters as they have "been punished sufficiently (Jamieson, Fausset, and Brown Commentary)." Paul writes in 2:7, "As a result, you should instead forgive and comfort [them]. Otherwise, [they] may be overwhelmed by excessive grief."

If 2 Corinthians 1:3-4 sounds familiar, it may be that you heard the passage proclaimed at a funeral. The words are often spoken by the presiding minister. And, that should not surprise us. What an appropriate time to declare the comfort we ourselves have received from God, in order that we may comfort one another!

It is this type of comfort we find Paul expounding in 2 Corinthians. And, this passage pairs well with the LuMinHoS vision statement to "present the comfort of Christ to all Lutheran patients admitted to Saskatoon hospitals." It is exactly this type of Christian comfort Paul urges the Corinthian church (and so us) to freely dispense. Christians can proclaim such comfort because we ourselves first received it from God. The 'it' here is aptly told through the wonderful words of John 3:16.

Such reassuring comfort is proclaimed to patients through the reading of scripture; the sacrament of Holy Communion; devotional books and the LuMinHoS brochure, filled with meaningful ...

passages of scripture and prayers. The comfort of Christ often is identified through tears as a meaningful prayer is prayed with the patient. And, sometimes, the comfort of Christ is sacredly present in simply being a presence at the bedside. Or, holding a hand to assure a patient I deeply care, because, God in Christ deeply cares for them.

For many patients, the road to recovery is just beginning. Or, recovery has yet to become a

reality. Regardless, we joyfully proclaim that the comfort of Christ goes before us and with us; preparing us in mind, body, and spirit for the abounding love of God to compassionately accompany us along our hospital journey.
