CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Reflection Text: Matthew 6:25-34. "But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today." Matthew 6:33-34

As I write this, LuMinHoS is in the midst of giving thanks to God for the unexpected success of our 6th Annual Walkathon. Since its creation, it raises a few to several thousand dollars annually. This

year, donors like you helped us raise just \$5 shy of \$10,000! We are humbled by the generosity of Lutherans and their friends who helped us achieve this milestone.

The ministry of hospital chaplaincy is so vital for patients and family alike. It would be difficult to access compassionate and Spirit-filled care without it. In a situation where patients may not remember who their pastor is (due to trauma), or, if a patient is not well connected to a congregation, they would simply have no

pastoral care available to them; the comfort and peace of Christ would not be proclaimed by a lay visitor or chaplain at a time when they need to hear God's abundant love and grace the most.

The LuMinHoS Events and Communications committees announced the up-and-coming Oktoberfest fundraiser at the end of September. With anticipation, planning began on a high, waving a cautious yet confident 'good-bye' to the COVID-19 concerns of yesterday. Once October arrived, coughs and colds and bugs of every kind seemed to be everywhere. And, COVID continued to re-assert itself, reminding us that as much as we want to forget, it has not yet 'left the building.' Winter's abrupt appearance and the already shortening days, combined with other planning concerns for our Oktoberfest fundraising celebration, found some of us asking the question, "What do we do? What if Oktoberfest is not the success we want it to be for LuMinHoS?

Jesus reminds us, "Do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, [...] if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive

today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you? [...] Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." In our suffering and brokenness and worry, we all too often forget (or lose faith in) God's neverending ability to love and care for us. Sending his Son to earth to reconcile the

world, we should know without a doubt God clothes us in love . . . not because of what we can or



cannot do . . . but in spite of our achievements and failures. God loves us and always meets us where we are.

The Holy Spirit empowers us to do the same, that we may fulfill Christ's command to love. And indeed, in this ministry, and, with our very lives, we endeavor to love as Christ loves. So, when we first seek the kingdom of God and his righteousness, it does not matter if, according to our standards, we succeed or fail. What matters most

to God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, is, do we know how well God clothes and cares for us so we may love ourselves and others as freely as He does? May we answer Christ's command, freed by the knowledge of God's unconditional love of us, calling us to love others just as unconditionally . . . in spite of impending failure or success. Thanks be to God. Amen!


