Chaplain Ron Bestvater's Message: Amazing Love, Amazing Grace

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have everlasting life." -John 3:16

Ross Volmer is one of the people who makes Holding Crosses for the Lutheran Care Society. He got the pattern from Henry Wichert, who started the idea here in Saskatoon. He picked it up from a Christian Digest article that told the story of the man who made the first one to fit in the hand of his wife who was in a coma. When she awoke, she asked "Where's my holding cross?", thus the name. For a long while Henry was alone in making the Holding Crosses. A number of people have since joined the corp. We give out the crosses in the hospitals in Saskatoon to help people remember to pray for others, and

comfort to people by remembering as they hold on to the cross that God is holding on to them by the cross of Jesus. Ross has made several hundred of the holding crosses now. Ewald held it when he had his last communion with Pastor David. One woman had it put on a leather strap so she could wear it when she couldn't hold it. A number of people have made reaching for the cross their last act. We want to say thank you to the people who make these holding crosses. We haven't forgotten the people who make other kinds of crosses but we'll remember them another time. But most importantly, we want to

praise and thank our Heavenly Father for our Saviour Jesus Christ on the Cross. Praise be to Jesus! Amen! Such amazing love, such amazing grace.

VOLUNTEER MANAGEMENT TEAM

The LCS Board of Directors has undertaken a process of restructuring the organization. A significant reason for this change is to ease the load of day-to-day administrative and planning tasks for the Chaplain, allowing a more complete focus on the hospital ministry. Within this Management team with Rev. Harold Hesje as chair are four committees: FINANCE (John Riggs 306 270-0258) is working to assist the board and the Treasurer in managing the finances of the Lutheran Care Society in order to meet the goals of a full-time chaplain. This includes increased ease of donations to the LCS through Canada Helps website and pre-authorized donations (PAD).

COMMUNICATIONS (Ruth Bachiu 306-683-3440) has the task of raising the profile of the LCS through current and new communication means. The LCS now has a dedicated email (luthcaresoc@sasktel.net) and will soon have a Facebook page where information will be posted.

EVENTS (Rhonda Gore Billard 306 244-4743 and Wendy Stevenson 306 373-2713) is tasked with creating events to celebrate and to pray for the work of the LCS, as well as providing fundraising opportunities.
