THOUGHTS FROM CHAPLAIN RICHARD

"Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go." Joshua 1:9

Shortly after our July Newsletter was published, new protocols were put in place by the Saskatchewan Health Authority to further protect patient confidentiality. The healing and protection of hospital patients should be tantamount, for the hospitalized are typically in a vulnerable state and deserve optimal care. But, the SHA's reinterpretation of Saskatchewan's health and privacy act led to their decision to remove a patient's denominational preference upon discharge.

Further, Saskatchewan residents have yet to be informed of this change. They have yet to be informed to tell their admissions nurse what their denomination is, should no one ask them when they are admitted. Being Lutheran was always something that remained on your healthcare file. Not anymore. The ability to respond to acute care/unconscious Lutherans in a timely manner is now compromised. As chaplain, July was indeed a frightening month. LuMinHoS has done their utmost to inform clergy and congregations of the changes. Our ministry in the hospitals, from a logistical and information gathering perspective, has forever been changed. But, we are learning!

More recently, the weekend before Thanksgiving, there was an incident in the Royal University chapel that resulted in an upset in chapel furnishings, yet negligible damage. A swift and unilateral decision was made to reduce the chapel's operating hours from round the clock accessibility to just 10 hours a day.

This article indeed sounds like a devastating blow to our ministry work and hospital chaplaincy overall.

I need to remember to stand firm in the faith. Yes, this is discouraging, but God opens windows where doors seem to have permanently closed shut. Nothing is impossible for God! (Matthew 19:26)

For example, LuMinHoS has been able to fully resume chapel services at both City and Royal University hospitals. I've been given a gift to lead Wednesday services and a small yet thankful number of patients and staff attend each week. The United Church chaplaincy has been able to lead services on those occasions when I am needed elsewhere. And, the opportunity for LuMinHoS to grow its worship assistant volunteer pool is once again a possibili ty.



So, in closing, while our faith seems to get shaken from time to time, God's faithfulness is unwavering. I need to remember that ... we all do. God in Christ, in the wondrous presence of the Holy Spirit goes before us and goes with us, encouraging us especially in those moments when the only option

seems to be to disparage. Thank you to all of you, for your prayers, big or small, your donations, big or small ... they are so appreciated! To those who were able to take part in the walk-a-thon in September and our 45th Anniversary Fundraiser at the Western Development Museum, thank you! Indeed, there is little reason to disparage. Rather, in Christ, we are called to be strong and courageous in faith, freely giving and always discerning the Spirit's call to remain faithful while loving and serving others as we do in this ministry. May you know the comfort of Christ is with you always!

The vision for and relevance of a new logo for LuMinHoS was pioneered and developed through the LuMinHoS Communications Committee in consultation with the Chaplain and Board. Our new logo was revealed at the 45th Anniversary Gala on Nov. 2 with many positive responses to it's clear presentation of the LuMinHoS ministry.

Jesus said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick. Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' Matthew 9:12-13

Our eyes are drawn to the image of the patient and caregiver. The caregiver is Christ, the Great Physician. The caregiver could also be one of us, the 'little Christs' (as Martin Luther said) who carry out Christ's great love command. The lay visitor and chaplain are prime examples of this. 
